



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

Q4 How would you rate the value of city services for the city taxes paid in Georgetown?



Q5 How would you rate the City's efforts to address the impacts of growth?



Q6 What amount of funding change would you support to help manage traffic in our city?



Q7 What amount of funding change would you support to help manage infrastructure/roads in our city?







Q12 To what extent do you agree with the following statement? I am usually able to provide valuable input to the City regarding fees and expenses.



Q13 To what extent do you agree with the following statement? Through this process, I was able to provide valuable input to the City regarding fees and expenses.



Q14 In future years, how would you like to provide feedback about the City budget? Check all that apply:







Q21 Do you own or rent your home?



Q22 What is your annual household income?



Q23 What is your race and/or ethnic origin (check all that apply)?



Q24 What is your gender?


